



When you have a curved glass in an antique piece of furniture or in any other piece of furniture with curves, or other curved glass items, here's how to get a quote for the cost Exact replacement of your curved glass.

If you have a portion of your glass still intact, you can send us a template of your curve.

1. Place a sheet on a flat
2. Take your glass and put it on the upright paper (such as photo)
3. Using a pencil or feather draw the entire contour of your glass.

When you remove your glass from the paper you get a drawing such as below. Then you can send it to us by mail and with this template we can check the thickness of your glass and its curve, so you can confirm that we have a mold to produce your glass.





For your curved glass for antique furniture or any antique object with a curved glass, You can take the approximate measure of your glass and then with the information we will receive by email we will be able to write you an approximate replacement cost quote. It is worth noting that as long as we do not have a stencil or your antique glass or door we can only confirm that we have a mold to produce the glass.







For an antique clock, you can measure the circumference in the same way that this photo the circumference is approximately 5" 1/4. You can also take the glass if you have the broken parts and we make a template as shown above using a paper and pencils and send us all through the mail, we can make you a quote from the photo since we Let's see the approximate measure.
